Autumn Crochet Placemat Pattern

Skill Level: Beginner-friendly

Materials:

- **Yarn:** Worsted weight cotton yarn in four colors (Color A, Color B, Color C, Color D approximately 25 grams of each).
- Crochet Hook: Size 2.75 mm (or size needed to achieve gauge)
- Scissors
- Yarn Needle (for weaving in ends)

Gauge: Not critical for this project, but if you want to match the size in the video, aim for approximately 8 double crochets and 8 rows per 4 inches.

Finished Size: Approximately 11.5 inches (29 cm) in diameter with tassels, 9.5 inches (24 cm) without tassels.

Abbreviations:

- ch = chain
- st = stitch
- sl st = slip stitch
- sc = single crochet
- dc = double crochet

Special Stitches:

• **Magic Ring:** Learn how to make a magic ring if you aren't already familiar with it. There are plenty of tutorials online.

Pattern Notes:

- This pattern involves frequent color changes. Have your yarn ready to go so you can switch colors easily.
- It's a good idea to use stitch markers to keep track of your rounds.
- The stitch counts are provided for each round, but double-check as you go. Mistakes can happen!
- This pattern features a lot of double crochets, so make sure you're comfortable with this stitch before you begin.
- The tassel-making portion is explained in the last part of the instructions.

Instructions:

Round 1: Foundation Round (Beige/Cream)

- 1. Make a magic ring.
- 2. Ch 4 (counts as a dc).
- 3. 8 dc in the magic ring.
- 4. SI st in the top of the first ch. (You should have 8 dc in your round.)

Round 2: (Beige/Cream)

- 1. Ch 3 (counts as a dc).
- 3 dc in the first space.
 (You'll have 3 dc plus the starting chain, for a total of 4 dc)
- 3. *Repeat* 3 dc in each of the remaining 7 spaces.
- 4. SI st in the top of the first ch. (You should have 32 dc in your round.)

Round 3: (Beige/Cream)

- 1. Ch 3 (counts as a dc).
- 2. 3 dc in the first space.
- 3. 2 dc in the next space.
- 4. Repeat 3 dc, 2 dc in the following spaces until the end of the round.
- 5. SI st in the top of the first ch. (You should have 40 dc in your round.)

Round 4: (Beige/Cream)

- 1. Ch 1.
- 2. Sc in the same space.
- 3. Sc in each st around.
- 4. SI st in the top of the first sc. (You should have 40 sc in your round.)

Round 5: (Beige/Cream)

- 1. Ch 4 (counts as a dc).
- 2. Skip 1 space.
- 3. Dc in the next space.
- 4. Ch 2, skip 1 space, dc in the next space.
- 5. Repeat ch 2, skip 1 space, dc in the next space, around until the end of the round.
- 6. Ch 2, sl st in the top of the third ch.
- 7. Ch 1.
- SI st in the first dc of the round. (You should have 24 dc spaces in your round.)

Round 6: (Beige/Cream)

- 1. Ch 3 (counts as a dc).
- 2 dc in the same space.
 (You should have 3 dc including the starting chain.)
- 3. *Repeat* 2 dc in each space around.
- 4. SI st in the top of the first ch. (You should have 72 dc in your round.)

Round 7: (Beige/Cream)

- 1. Ch 3 (counts as a dc).
- 2. 2 dc in the first space.
- 3. 1 dc in the next space.
- 4. Repeat 2 dc, 1 dc in the following spaces until the end of the round.
- 5. SI st in the top of the first ch. (You should have 96 dc in your round.)

Round 8: (Beige/Cream)

- 1. Ch 1.
- 2. Sc in the same space.
- 3. Sc in each st around.
- 4. SI st in the top of the first sc. (You should have 96 sc in your round.)

Round 9: (Green)

- 1. Fasten off the beige/cream yarn.
- 2. Attach green yarn.
- 3. Ch 5 (counts as a dc + ch 2).
- 4. Skip 2 spaces.
- 5. Dc in the next space.
- 6. Ch 3, skip 2 spaces, dc in the next space.
- 7. Repeat ch 3, skip 2 spaces, dc in the next space, around until the end of the round.
- 8. Ch 3, sl st in the top of the third ch.
- 9. Ch 1.
- 10. Cut and fasten off green yarn. (You should have 32 dc spaces in your round.)

Round 10: (Mustard/Yellow)

- 1. Fasten off the green yarn.
- 2. Attach mustard/yellow yarn.
- 3. Ch 3 (counts as a dc).
- 4. 2 dc in the first space.
- 5. *Repeat* 2 dc in each space around.
- 6. SI st in the top of the first ch.(You should have 96 dc in your round.)

Round 11: (Orange)

- 1. Fasten off the mustard/yellow yarn.
- 2. Attach orange yarn.
- 3. Ch 3 (counts as a dc).

- 4. 2 dc in the first space.
- 5. 1 dc in the next space.
- 6. *Repeat* 2 dc, 1 dc in the following spaces until the end of the round.
- 7. SI st in the top of the first ch.
- 8. Cut and fasten off orange yarn. (You should have 128 dc in your round.)

Round 12: (Brown)

- 1. Fasten off the orange yarn.
- 2. Attach brown yarn.
- 3. Ch 1.
- 4. Sc in the same space.
- 5. Sc in each st around.
- 6. SI st in the top of the first sc. (You should have 128 sc in your round.)

Round 13: (Green)

- 1. Fasten off the brown yarn.
- 2. Attach green yarn.
- 3. Ch 4 (counts as a dc + ch 2).
- 4. Skip 2 spaces.
- 5. Dc in the next space.
- 6. Ch 3, skip 2 spaces, dc in the next space.
- 7. *Repeat* ch 3, skip 2 spaces, dc in the next space, around until the end of the round.
- 8. Ch 2, sl st in the top of the third ch.
- 9. SI st in the first dc of the round. *(You should have 32 dc spaces in your round.)*

Round 14: (Green)

- 1. Ch 3 (counts as a dc).
- 2. 3 dc in the first space.
- 3. Repeat 3 dc in each space around.
- 4. SI st in the top of the first ch. (You should have 96 dc in your round.)

Round 15: (Green)

- 1. Ch 1.
- 2. Sc in the same space.
- 3. Sc in each st around.

4. SI st in the top of the first sc. (You should have 96 sc in your round.)

Round 16: (Green)

- 1. Ch 1.
- 2. Sc in the same space.
- 3. Sc in each st around.
- 4. SI st in the top of the first sc. (You should have 96 sc in your round.)

Round 17: (Green)

- 1. Ch 1.
- 2. Sc in the same space.
- 3. Sc in each st around.
- 4. SI st in the top of the first sc. (You should have 96 sc in your round.)

Round 18: (Green - Tassel Preparation)

- 1. Ch 3 (counts as a dc + ch 2).
- 2. Skip 2 spaces.
- 3. Sc in the next space.
- 4. Ch 3, skip 2 spaces, sc in the next space.
- 5. *Repeat* ch 3, skip 2 spaces, sc in the next space, around until the end of the round.
- 6. Ch 2, sl st in the top of the third ch.
- Fasten off. (You should have 32 sc spaces in your round.)

Tassel Making:

- 1. Cut 8 lengths of yarn (about 15cm/6 inches) for each tassel.
- 2. Fold them in half and use a slip knot to attach them to each chain space.
- 3. Once all the tassels are attached, trim the tops to a uniform length (3cm/1.2 inches is suggested in the video).
- 4. Use the steam function of your iron to smooth out the tassels for a neat finish.

Weaving in Ends:

Weave in any loose ends using a yarn needle.

Finishing Touches:

Gently block your placemat if desired.

Sizing Tips and Adjustments:

• Increasing Size: To make a larger placemat, you can add extra rounds in the initial beige/cream rounds. This will create a larger base and increase the size proportionally.

• **Decreasing Size:** To make a smaller placemat, you can decrease the number of stitches in the earlier rounds. For example, you can start with 6 dc in the foundation round instead of 8. Just remember that this will affect the proportions of the pattern.

Important: When making changes, it's essential to ensure that your increases and decreases are evenly distributed throughout the round to maintain the circular shape.
