Crochet Autumn Leaf Pattern

Materials:

- Himalaya Amigurumi cotton yarn (or any worsted weight yarn) in autumn colors (e.g., red, orange, yellow, brown).
- 2.5 mm crochet hook.
- · Yarn needle for weaving in ends.

Sizing:

- This pattern creates a leaf approximately 6 cm wide and 11 cm long (including the stem).
- You can easily adjust the leaf's size by changing the initial chain length and the number of rows.

Stitches Used:

- Chain (ch)
- Single crochet (sc)
- Slip stitch (sl st)

Abbreviations:

- ch: chain
- sc: single crochet
- sl st: slip stitch
- st(s): stitch(es)
- sp: space

Special Instructions:

- Working into the Back Loop: For many rows, you'll work into the back loop only of the stitches below. This gives the leaf a nice texture.
- Increases: We'll make increases using "1 sc, 2 ch, 1 sc" in chain spaces to create the leaf's points.
- **Decreases:** We'll naturally decrease the width of the leaf each row by not working into the last 2 sts of each row.
- Row Numbers: The row numbers refer to the rows of the leaf body, excluding the stem.

The Leaf

Row 1:

- 1. Make a slip knot and ch 15.
- 2. Starting in the 2nd ch from the hook, sc 13 across.
- 3. In the last ch, sc 1, ch 2, sc 1. (This creates the first point of the leaf.)
- 4. Turn your work.

Row 2:

1. Ch 1.

- 2. Working in the back loops only, sc across the row, working into each sc below, until you reach the 2-ch space.
- 3. Sc 1, ch 2, sc 1 in the 2-ch sp.
- 4. Continue sc across the rest of the row, making sure not to sc in the last 2 sts.
- 5. Turn your work.

Row 3:

- 1. Ch 1.
- 2. Sc across the row, working into the back loops, until you reach the 2-ch sp.
- 3. Sc 1, ch 2, sc 1 in the 2-ch sp.
- 4. Continue sc across the rest of the row, omitting the last 2 sts.
- 5. Turn your work.

Row 4:

- 1. Ch 1.
- 2. Sc across the row, working into the back loops, until you reach the 2-ch sp.
- 3. Sc 1, ch 2, sc 1 in the 2-ch sp.
- 4. Continue sc across the rest of the row, omitting the last 2 sts.
- 5. Turn your work.

Row 5:

- 1. Ch 1.
- 2. Sc across the row, working into the back loops, until you reach the 2-ch sp.
- 3. Sc 1, ch 2, sc 1 in the 2-ch sp.
- 4. The first sc after the ch-2 space should be made over the 2nd sc of the 2-ch sp from the row below.
- 5. Continue sc across the rest of the row, omitting the last 2 sts.
- 6. Turn your work.

Row 6:

- 1. Ch 1.
- 2. Sc across the row, working into the back loops, until you reach the 2-ch sp.
- 3. Sc 1, ch 2, sc 1 in the 2-ch sp.
- 4. The first sc after the ch-2 space should be made over the 2nd sc of the 2-ch sp from the row below.
- 5. Continue sc across the rest of the row, omitting the last 2 sts.
- 6. Turn your work.

Row 7:

- 1. Ch 1.
- 2. Sc across the row, working into the back loops, until you reach the 2-ch sp.

- 3. Sc 1, ch 2, sc 1 in the 2-ch sp.
- 4. The first sc after the ch-2 space should be made over the 2nd sc of the 2-ch sp from the row below.
- 5. Continue sc across the rest of the row, omitting the last 2 sts.
- 6. Turn your work.

Row 8:

- 1. Ch 1.
- 2. Sc across the row, working into the back loops, until you reach the 2-ch sp.
- 3. Sc 1, ch 2, sc 1 in the 2-ch sp.
- 4. The first sc after the ch-2 space should be made over the 2nd sc of the 2-ch sp from the row below.
- 5. Continue sc across the rest of the row, omitting the last 2 sts.
- 6. Turn your work.

...and so on until you have the desired number of "steps" or "points" on your leaf

Final Row (Leaf Stem):

- 1. Ch 1, turn your work.
- 2. Sc across the row, working into the back loops, until you reach the 2-ch sp.
- 3. Sc 1 in the 2-ch sp.
- 4. Ch 9. (This creates the stem.)
- 5. SI st 8 across the chain.
- 6. Sc 1 in the next 2-ch sp.
- 7. Sc across the row, omitting the last 2 sts.
- 8. Fasten off and weave in the yarn ends.

Finishing:

- 1. SI st across the top of the leaf, joining the top of the leaf at the first sc of the first ch-2 space of the row below.
- 2. Continue with sl st along the chain (stem)

Tips for Customization:

- Vary the Colors: Experiment with different yarn shades for a unique look.
- Leaf Size: To make a wider leaf, start with a longer foundation chain. To make it longer, add more rows.
- Stem Length: Adjust the chain length in the final row for a shorter or longer stem.
