# **Crochet Pumpkin Basket Pattern**

Alright, let's get crafty! Here's a complete written pattern for the crochet pumpkin basket, with extra tips and tricks:

## **Materials:**

- Yarn:
  - o Main Color (MC): Himalaya Himagurumi cotton yarn (or similar weight yarn) approximately 100g
  - Contrasting Color 1 (CC1): Brown yarn for the stem approximately 10g
  - o Contrasting Color 2 (CC2): Green yarn for the leaves approximately 10g
- Crochet Hook: 2.75 mm (or size appropriate for your chosen yarn)
- Yarn Needle
- Scissors

# Gauge:

Gauge is not crucial for this project, but if you want to match the size in the video, aim for approximately 10 double crochets (dc) and 12 rows in a 4-inch square.

#### **Abbreviations:**

- ch: chain
- sl st: slip stitch
- sc: single crochet
- hdc: half double crochet
- dc: double crochet
- st: stitch
- rnd: round
- BLO: back loop only
- inc: increase (make 2 stitches in one stitch)
- dec: decrease (combine 2 stitches into 1)

#### Notes:

- The basket is worked in the round, starting with a chain and then creating rows.
- The back loops only (BLO) are used for most stitches to create a ridged effect and help the basket hold its shape.
- You can adjust the size of the basket by changing the number of starting chains and rows (see instructions below).
- The pattern uses two strands of yarn held together throughout most of the body and lid to create a thicker fabric.

## Let's Get Started!

## Part 1: The Basket Body

#### **Row 1:**

- 1. Make a slip knot on your hook.
- 2. Chain (ch) 20. (This is the height of your pumpkin make more chains for a taller pumpkin.)
- 3. Skip the first 3 chains.
- 4. Work 10 double crochets (dc) in the next 10 chains (you should have 11 total dc with the starting chain).
- 5. Work 3 half double crochets (hdc) in the next 3 chains.
- 6. Work 2 single crochets (sc) in the next 2 chains.
- 7. Work 2 slip stitches (sl st) in the next 2 chains.
- 8. Chain 1, turn your work.

#### Row 2:

- 1. Work 2 sl st in the back loops of the 2 sl st from the previous row.
- 2. Work 2 sc in the back loops of the 2 sc from the previous row.
- 3. Work 3 hdc in the back loops of the 3 hdc from the previous row.
- 4. Work 11 dc in the back loops of the 11 dc from the previous row.
- 5. Work the final dc in the top loop of the last chain.
- 6. Chain 3, turn your work.

## Row 3 - Row 26 (Repeat):

- 1. Work 11 dc in the back loops of the 11 dc from the previous row.
- 2. Work 3 hdc in the back loops of the 3 hdc from the previous row.
- 3. Work 2 sc in the back loops of the 2 sc from the previous row.
- 4. Work 2 sl st in the back loops of the 2 sl st from the previous row.
- 5. Chain 3, turn your work.

# Finishing the Basket Body:

- 1. Cut your yarn, leaving a long tail.
- 2. Fold the piece of crochet in half, with the starting chain on one side and the last row on the other side.
- 3. Work a sl st along the starting chain side and into the loops on the last row, until you reach the end of the row. This joins the sides together to create a round base.

# **Puckering the Base:**

- 1. Cut one of the two strands of yarn.
- 2. With the remaining strand, work a single crochet (sc) through the back loops along the base of the basket. This creates the puckering effect and gives the basket a nice rounded shape.
- 3. Pull gently on the loop to tighten the crochet.

# Part 2: The Basket Lid

## Row 1:

- 1. Make a slip knot on your hook.
- 2. Chain (ch) 14.
- 3. Skip the first 3 chains.
- 4. Work 5 dc in the next 5 chains (you should have 6 total dc with the starting chain).
- 5. Work 2 hdc in the next 2 chains.
- 6. Work 2 sc in the next 2 chains.
- 7. Work 2 sl st in the next 2 chains.
- 8. Chain 1, turn your work.

#### **Row 2:**

- 1. Work 2 sl st in the back loops of the 2 sl st from the previous row.
- 2. Work 2 sc in the back loops of the 2 sc from the previous row.
- 3. Work 2 hdc in the back loops of the 2 hdc from the previous row.
- 4. Work 6 dc in the back loops of the 6 dc from the previous row.
- 5. Work the final dc in the top loop of the last chain.
- 6. Chain 3, turn your work.

# Row 3 - Row 30 (Repeat):

- 1. Work 6 dc in the back loops of the 6 dc from the previous row.
- 2. Work 2 hdc in the back loops of the 2 hdc from the previous row.
- 3. Work 2 sc in the back loops of the 2 sc from the previous row.
- 4. Work 2 sl st in the back loops of the 2 sl st from the previous row.
- 5. Chain 3, turn your work.

# Finishing the Lid:

- 1. Cut your yarn, leaving a long tail.
- 2. Fold the piece of crochet in half, with the starting chain on one side and the last row on the other side.
- 3. Work a sl st along the starting chain side and into the loops on the last row, until you reach the end of the row. This joins the sides together to create a round lid.
- 4. Repeat the puckering technique from the basket body at the point where you'll attach the handle.

## Part 3: The Handle

# Row 1:

- 1. Make a magic ring.
- 2. Chain (ch) 1.
- 3. Work 8 single crochet (sc) in the ring.
- 4. Work a sl st into the top of the first chain.

# Row 2 - Row 7 (Repeat):

- 1. Chain (ch) 1.
- 2. Work 8 sc in the back loops of the 8 sc from the previous row.
- 3. Work a sl st into the top of the first chain.

## Finishing the Handle:

1. Cut your yarn, leaving a long tail.

#### Part 4: The Stem and Leaf

#### The Stem:

 Using the dark brown yarn (or your desired color), sew a small circle of stitches to the top of the lid, creating a stem shape.

#### The Leaf:

- 1. Switch to green yarn (or your desired color).
- 2. Make a slip knot and chain (ch) 25 (for the long leaf) or 20 (for the short leaf).
- 3. Work 2 hdc into the third chain from the hook.
- 4. Work 1 hdc into the next chain.
- 5. Work 2 hdc into the next chain.
- 6. Work 1 hdc into the next chain.
- 7. Continue working 1 hdc and 2 hdc until you reach the end of the chain.
- 8. Work a sl st into the top of the handle.

## Finishing:

1. Sew the leaf and stem to the lid of the basket.

# **Size Adjustments:**

- Increasing the Rows: To make a bigger basket, add more rows to the body and lid sections. For example, if you want a taller basket, add a few more rows to the basket body. If you want a wider basket, add a few more rows to both the basket body and the lid.
- Decreasing the Rows: To make a smaller basket, decrease the number of rows in both the basket body and the lid.

# Now, you have a beautiful crochet pumpkin basket!

#### Tips:

- Practice the stitches: You can practice the basic stitches on a scrap piece of yarn before starting on the actual project.
- Watch videos: There are great tutorials online for the different crochet stitches if you need a visual guide.
- Don't be afraid to experiment: You can always add your own personal touch to the design by changing the colors or adding embellishments.
