Crochet Pumpkin Placemat Pattern

This pattern provides step-by-step instructions for creating a charming crochet pumpkin placemat. It's designed with beginners in mind, using clear language and detailed explanations.

Materials:

- Yarn: Worsted weight cotton yarn in your desired pumpkin color (orange, yellow, etc.), a darker color for the pumpkin's "rim" (black or brown), and a color for the handle and leaf (green or brown).
 - Example: Alize Cotton Gold or similar
- Crochet Hook: 2.75 mm
- Yarn Needle: For weaving in ends.
- Scissors

Abbreviations (US Terms):

- ch = chain
- sl st = slip stitch
- sc = single crochet
- hdc = half double crochet
- dc = double crochet
- st(s) = stitch(es)
- sp(s) = space(s)
- [...] = repeat instructions within brackets as indicated
- (...) = total number of stitches you should have at the end of the round/row

Gauge:

Gauge is not crucial for this project, but if you want to achieve a specific size, it's helpful to check your gauge. Create a small swatch using the dc stitch and compare it to the measurements given in the pattern. Adjust hook size if needed to match the desired size.

Notes:

- This pattern is worked in the round, starting with a magic ring.
- The chain-3 at the beginning of each round counts as a dc.
- When increasing, you will work 2 dc in the same stitch.
- The "rim" of the pumpkin is worked in a contrasting color in the final round of the pumpkin body.
- You can customize the size of the placemat by adding or removing rounds before starting the pumpkin sections.

Instructions:

Pumpkin Body:

Round 1 (Magic Ring):

- 1. Make a magic ring.
- 2. Ch 3 (counts as a dc).

- 3. 11 dc in the ring.
- 4. SI st in the top of the beginning ch-3. (12 sts)

Round 2:

- 1. Ch 3 (counts as a dc).
- 2. Dc in the same st as the sl st.
- 3. Ch 1.
- 4. 2 dc in the next st.
- 5. [Ch 1, 2 dc in the next st] repeat around.
- 6. SI st in the top of the beginning ch-3. (24 sts)

Round 3:

- 1. Ch 3 (counts as a dc).
- 2. 2 dc in the next st.
- 3. Ch 1.
- 4. Dc in the next st.
- 5. 2 dc in the next st.
- 6. [Ch 1, dc in the next st, 2 dc in the next st] repeat around.
- 7. SI st in the top of the beginning ch-3. (36 sts)

Round 4:

- 1. Ch 3 (counts as a dc).
- 2. Dc in the next st.
- 3. 2 dc in the next st.
- 4. Ch 1.
- 5. Dc in the next 2 sts.
- 6. 2 dc in the next st.
- 7. [Ch 1, dc in the next 2 sts, 2 dc in the next st] repeat around.
- 8. Sl st in the top of the beginning ch-3. (48 sts)

Round 5:

- 1. Ch 3 (counts as a dc).
- 2. Dc in the next 2 sts.
- 3. 2 dc in the next st.
- 4. Ch 1.
- 5. Dc in the next 3 sts.
- 6. 2 dc in the next st.
- 7. [Ch 1, dc in the next 3 sts, 2 dc in the next st] repeat around.

8. SI st in the top of the beginning ch-3. (60 sts)

Continue Increasing:

Continue following the pattern established in Rounds 2-5. In each round, you will:

- Increase the number of dc you work before the increase by one.
- Work your increases (2 dc in one st) with a ch-1 sp in between.

Example: Round 6:

- 1. Ch 3 (counts as a dc).
- 2. Dc in the next 3 sts.
- 3. 2 dc in the next st.
- 4. Ch 1.
- 5. Dc in the next 4 sts.
- 6. 2 dc in the next st.
- 7. [Ch 1, dc in the next 4 sts, 2 dc in the next st] repeat around.
- 8. SI st in the top of the beginning ch-3. (72 sts)

Adjusting Size:

- **To make the placemat larger:** Continue adding rounds, following the increasing pattern, until you reach your desired size.
- **To make the placemat smaller:** Stop increasing after fewer rounds (e.g., stop after Round 6 or 7 for a smaller placemat).

Pumpkin Sections (Round 8):

Note: Assuming you worked until Round 8, you should have 96 sts.

- 1. Ch 1.
- 2. 10 sc in the next 10 sts.
- 3. Ch 9.
- 4. Skip 2 sts.
- 5. Dc in the next st.
- 6. Ch 3.
- 7. Skip 2 sts.
- 8. Dc in the next st.
- 9. [Ch 3, skip 2 sts, dc in the next st] repeat 10 more times.
- 10. Ch 4.
- 11. Skip 2 sts.
- 12. 13 sc in the next 13 sts.
- 13. **Repeat steps 3 12** on the other side of the pumpkin, mirroring the placement of the ch-sps and sc groups.
- 14. Sl st in the first sc. (96 sts)

Pumpkin Rim (Round 9):

Change to your darker color yarn.

- 1. Ch 1.
- 2. 10 sc in the next 10 sts.
- 3. Hdc in the next st.
- 4. 3 dc in the next ch-sp.
- 5. Dc in the next dc.
- 6. [3 dc in the next ch-sp, dc in the next dc] repeat around until you reach the sc group on the other side.
- 7. Hdc in the st before the sc group.
- 8. 13 sc in the next 13 sc.
- 9. **Repeat steps 3-8** on the other side of the pumpkin.
- 10. SI st in the first sc. (120 sts)

Round 10:

Continue with the darker color yarn.

- 1. Ch 1.
- 2. 10 sc in the next 10 sc.
- 3. Hdc in the next hdc.
- 4. Dc in each st around until you reach the next hdc.
- 5. Hdc in the next hdc.
- 6. 13 sc in the next 13 sc.
- 7. **Repeat steps 3-6** on the other side of the pumpkin.
- 8. SI st in the first sc. (120 sts)

Round 11:

Continue with the darker color yarn. This round is identical to Round 10.

Final Round of Pumpkin (Round 12):

Continue with the darker color yarn.

- 1. Ch 1.
- 2. 10 sc in the next 10 sc.
- 3. Sc in the next hdc.
- 4. Dc in each st around until you reach the next sc.
- 5. Sc in the next sc.
- 6. 13 sc in the next 13 sc.
- 7. **Repeat steps 3-6** on the other side of the pumpkin.
- 8. SI st in the first sc. (120 sts)

Pumpkin Handle (make 2):

Change to your handle/leaf color yarn.

- 1. Attach yarn with a sl st in the 5th sc of a 13-sc group (at the top of the pumpkin).
- 2. Ch 1.
- 3. 5 sc in the next 5 sts.
- 4. Ch 1, turn.
- 5. 5 sc in the next 5 sts.
- 6. Ch 1, turn.
- 7. 5 sc in the next 5 sts.
- 8. Ch 1, turn.
- 9. Skip 1 st.
- 10. 2 sc in the next 2 sts.
- 11. Skip 1 st.
- 12. Sc in the last st.
- 13. Ch 1, turn.
- 14. Ch 2.
- 15. Sc in the last st.
- 16. Fasten off and weave in ends.

Pumpkin Leaf:

Continue with your handle/leaf color yarn.

- 1. Ch 25.
- 2. Hdc in the 3rd ch from the hook.
- 3. Hdc in the next ch.
- 4. 2 hdc in the next ch.
- 5. Hdc in the next ch.
- 6. [2 hdc in the next ch, hdc in the next ch] repeat across the remaining chs.
- 7. SI st to the base of the ch where you started.
- 8. Fasten off and weave in ends.

Finishing:

- Weave in all loose ends securely.
- Block the placemat if desired to help it lay flat and even out the stitches. (Blocking is optional but recommended for cotton yarn).

Congratulations! You've crocheted a beautiful pumpkin placemat!

Additional Notes:

• Feel free to experiment with different color combinations to create unique pumpkins.

- You could also add embellishments like embroidery or buttons to further personalize your placemat.
- To make a set of placemats, simply repeat the pattern as many times as needed!
