# **Crochet Christmas Ball Keychain Pattern**

#### **Materials Needed**

Yarn: Himalaya Himagurumi cotton yarn in green, white, and gold/silver glitter thread

Crochet Hook: Size 2.50 mm

Keychain Clip: For attaching your finished ball

Yarn Needle: For weaving in ends

Bead Fiber Filling: To stuff the ball

Scissors: For cutting yarn

# **Basic Crochet Techniques**

1. **Chain Stitch:** Start by making a foundation chain.

- 2. **Single Crochet (sc):** Insert your hook into a stitch, yarn over, pull through, yarn over again, and pull through both loops on the hook.
- 3. **Increase:** Make two single crochets in one stitch.
- 4. **Decrease:** Close three stitches together to reduce the stitch count.

#### **Pattern Instructions**

This pattern creates a round ball with stripes. We'll crochet in rows, starting with a foundation chain and using single crochets. To create the ball shape, we'll increase stitches on odd-numbered rows and decrease stitches on even-numbered rows.

## **Starting the Ball**

1. Make a Slipknot: Begin by making a slipknot with the green yarn and place it on your hook.

#### 2. Foundation Chain:

• Chain 18 (make sure the chain is not too tight).

#### 3. First Row:

- Starting from the 2nd chain from the hook, make 1 single crochet in each chain until you reach the last chain.
- In the last chain, make 2 single crochets. This increases the stitch count.
- You should have a total of 19 stitches at the end of this row.

## 4. Turn Your Work:

• Chain 1 and turn your work.

## Creating the Body of the Ball

#### 5. Second Row:

- Starting from the back of the first single crochet, make 15 single crochets.
- Increase by making 2 single crochets in the next stitch.
- Decrease by closing 3 stitches together in the last two stitches (total of 17 stitches).

#### 6. Change Color:

• Switch to glitter yarn for the last stitch. Cut the green yarn and tie the glitter yarn.

#### 7. Third Row:

- Chain 1 and turn your work.
- Make 15 single crochets with the glitter yarn, increasing by making 2 single crochets in the last stitch (total of 17 stitches).
- Switch to white yarn while completing the last single crochet.

#### 8. Fourth Row:

- Chain 1 and turn your work.
- Repeat the second row using white yarn: make 15 single crochets, increase with 2 single crochets in the last stitch, then decrease by closing 3 stitches together.

## **Continuing the Pattern**

## 9. Repeat Rows:

- Alternate between two rows of green or white and one row of glitter yarn until you have completed a total of 30 rows. Use the following sequence:
  - 2 Rows of Green
  - 1 Row of Glitter
  - 2 Rows of White
  - 1 Row of Glitter
- Ensure you maintain the increases and decreases as described.

## Finishing the Ball

## 10. Finalizing the Shape:

- After reaching the desired height, weave in any remaining yarn ends.
- Stuff the ball with bead fiber filling to give it a nice shape.

#### 11. Attach the Keychain Clip:

• Use the yarn needle to sew the top of the ball shut and attach your keychain clip.

## 12. Optional Decoration:

• Use a piece of yarn to create a loop for hanging on a Christmas tree instead of a keychain clip.

# **Sizing Tips**

- If you want a larger ball, increase the foundation chain by groups of 6 (for example, chain 24 or 30 instead of 18). Each additional 6 chains will add height to your ball.
- Adjust the number of rows based on your desired size and yarn thickness.

#### Conclusion

This crochet Christmas ball keychain is a fantastic project for beginners and a lovely gift for the holiday season. Feel free to experiment with different color combinations and sizes. Happy crocheting!
