Granny Square Christmas Stocking Crochet Pattern

Materials:

Yarn:

- o Main Color (MC): Any medium weight cotton yarn (Himalaya Himagurumi is a good choice)
- Contrast Color 1 (CC1): Medium weight yarn in a color that complements your main color (e.g., red, green, white).
- o Contrast Color 2 (CC2): Medium weight yarn in a third color (e.g., gold, silver, brown).
- Crochet Hook: Size 2.50 mm (or size that works with your yarn).
- Scissors
- Yarn Needle

Abbreviations:

- ch chain
- sl st slip stitch
- dc double crochet
- tr triple crochet
- sc single crochet
- st(s): stitch(es)

Granny Square (4 Rows):

• Row 1 (MC):

- 1. Make a magic ring (like a tiny loop with your yarn).
- 2. ch 3 (counts as a dc), 2 dc in the ring.
- 3. ch 2, 3 dc in the ring.
- 4. ch 2, 3 dc in the ring.
- 5. ch 2, 3 dc in the ring.
- 6. ch 2, sl st to top of first ch (this closes the ring).
- 7. ch 1, cut yarn and leave a long tail.

Row 2 (CC1):

- 1. Join CC1 yarn with a sl st in any ch-2 space.
- 2. ch 3 (counts as a dc), 2 dc in the same ch-2 space (this creates the corner).
- 3. ch 2, 3 dc in the next ch-2 space.
- 4. ch 1, 3 dc in the next ch-2 space.
- 5. Repeat steps 3 and 4 for the rest of the row.

- 6. ch 1, sl st to top of first ch.
- 7. ch 1, cut yarn and leave a long tail.

Row 3 (CC2):

- 1. Join CC2 yarn with a sl st in any ch-1 space between corners.
- 2. ch 3 (counts as a dc), 2 dc in the same ch-1 space.
- 3. ch 2, 3 dc in the next ch-2 space.
- 4. ch 1, 3 dc in the next ch-1 space.
- 5. Repeat steps 3 and 4 for the rest of the row.
- 6. ch 1, sl st to top of first ch.
- 7. ch 1, cut yarn and leave a long tail.

Row 4 (MC):

- 1. Join MC yarn with a sl st in any ch-1 space between corners.
- 2. ch 3 (counts as a dc), 2 dc in the same ch-1 space.
- 3. ch 1, 3 dc in the next ch-2 space.
- 4. ch 1, 3 dc in the next ch-1 space.
- 5. Repeat steps 3 and 4 for the rest of the row, but in each ch-2 space (corner), make 2 ch only. (This creates the sides of the square).
- 6. ch 1, sl st to top of first ch.
- 7. ch 1, cut yarn and leave a long tail.

Seaming the Squares:

- 1. You'll now have two identical granny squares.
- 2. Lay them flat, right sides facing.
- 3. With CC1 yarn, join a sl st in the middle of a dc group on the first row of one square.
- 4. Make 10 tr in the middle dc group of the first row of the second square.
- 5. Now you'll join the squares together using sc stitches:
 - Sc in the top of each tr just made.
 - Sc in the top of the opposite dc (front and back loops) of the first square.
- 6. When you reach a corner, make 4 sc in the corner ch-2 space (front and back loops of the opposite corners).
- 7. Continue joining the sides with sc, working in the top loops of the opposite dc groups.
- 8. At the next corner, make 2 sc in the corner ch-2 space.
- 9. ch 20 (or desired length for the hanging loop).
- 10. SI st in the same ch-2 space as the last 2 sc.
- 11. Join the last two sides of the squares with sc, as before.

Top of the Stocking:

- 1. Ch 1, turn the work.
- 2. SI st in the top of each stitch along the edge of the square, including corners.
- 3. ch 1, turn.
- 4. Sc in the top of each stitch, including corners.
- 5. Sc in the top of each tr around the opening of the stocking, making sure to keep the shape consistent.
- 6. SI st in the same space where you joined CC1 yarn at the beginning of the seaming process.
- 7. ch 1, cut yarn and weave in ends.

Sizing Tips:

- Increasing Rows: To make a wider sock, simply add more rows to the granny squares before seaming. For example, you could add an extra 2 rows to each square.
- **Decreasing Rows:** To make a smaller sock, decrease the number of rows in the granny squares.

Finishing Touches:

• You can embellish your stocking with beads, buttons, or embroidery.
