

# Easy Crochet Wind Spinner – Written Pattern

## Materials

- Yarn: 5-ply medium-weight yarn (50% cotton, 50% acrylic)  
Choose 3–4 summer-themed colors for best results.
- Hook:
  - Main hook: 2.50 mm (US size B/1 or C/2, depending on brand)
  - Loop section: 2.20 mm (US size A/0 or slightly smaller steel hook)
- Notions: Yarn needle, scissors, fiberfill (optional), wooden beads or tassel (optional)

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## Wind Spinner Body

### Step 1: Chain Foundation

- With Color A, **ch 100** (approximately 35–40 cm).  
*You may adjust the length by chaining more or fewer.*

### Step 2: Row 1 – Single Crochet

- Starting in the **2nd ch from the hook**, sc in each ch across. (99 sc)
- At the end, **sc into the first ch** to close the loop (optional).
- **Ch 1**, cut the yarn, and fasten off.

### Step 3: Row 2 – Half Double Crochet

- Join the same color to the **first sc**.
- **2 hdc in each stitch** across. (198 hdc)
- At the end, ch 1, fasten off.

### Step 4: Row 3 – Double Crochet Clusters

- Join Color B to the first stitch.
- In the first hdc: **3 dc**, ch 1, skip 1, (*3 dc in next, ch 1, skip 1*) repeat to end.
- Finish with **2 dc in last hdc**, ch 1, fasten off.

### Step 5: Row 4 – Expanded Clusters

- Join Color C to the first dc of a cluster.
- In each **ch-1 space**, work **4 dc**.
- Between each cluster, always **ch 1**.
- End with 4 dc, ch 1, fasten off.

## Step 6: Row 5 – Final Ruffle

- Join Color D to the first dc of a cluster.
- In each **ch-1 space**, work **5 dc**.
- Continue with **ch 1** between clusters.
- Finish with 4 dc in last space, ch 1, fasten off.

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## Granny Square Center

You'll now crochet a small **2-round granny square** using any 2 colors.

### Round 1

- Start with a magic ring (or ch 4 and sl st to form a ring).
- *Ch 3 (counts as dc), 2 dc, ch 1* → repeat 4 times to make 4 groups.
- Sl st to top of beginning ch 3 to join. Fasten off.

### Round 2

- Join second color in any ch-1 corner space.
- *Sc, ch 2, sc* into each corner.
- Work **sc** into **every stitch** along sides.
- Repeat for all corners.
- Sl st to join and **cut the yarn, leaving a long tail** for sewing.

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## Final Assembly

### 1. Attach the Granny Square

- Using the yarn tail, sew the granny square to the **top end** of the spiral body using whip stitch or sc stitches.
- Secure tightly.

### 2. Add Beads or Tassel (Optional)

- Thread wooden beads or attach a tassel to the bottom corner of the granny square for added charm.

### 3. Create Hanging Loop

- Switch to a 2.20 mm hook.
- Join any yarn to the top corner of the granny square or from the first row of the spiral.
- Ch 35 (or preferred length), sl st back to base, ch 1, fasten off.

**4. Spiral Effect**

- Twist the spiral around its own axis to create the “wind spinner” shape.

**5. Finishing Touches**

- Weave in all ends using a yarn needle.
