

Easy Crochet Sunflower Keychain Pattern

This cute crochet sunflower keychain is a simple beginner-friendly project.

It works up with basic stitches, soft yarn, and a small hook. You can use it as a keychain or as a sweet little bag charm.

US terms

Materials

- Medium-weight yarn
 - **Green** for the center round
 - **Yellow** for the petals
 - **2.20 mm crochet hook**
 - Scissors
 - Yarn needle
 - Keychain clip or keyring
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Stitches Used

- **Magic Ring** = an adjustable ring used to start in the center
 - **ch** = chain
 - **sl st** = slip stitch
 - **Puff Stitch** = made by pulling up loops several times into the same stitch or space
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Helpful Notes for Beginners

- The flower center is made with **10 puff stitches**.
 - There are **2 chains between each puff stitch** in the center round.
 - The yellow petals are made by working into those chain spaces.
 - If you are new to puff stitches, work slowly and keep your loops a little loose. That makes it easier to pull through and shape the stitch neatly.
 - The starting chains in the petal round help form the petal shape together with the puff stitch and slip stitches.
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Pattern

Part 1: Make the Sunflower Center

Round 1

Step 1.

Start with a **magic ring**.

Step 2.

Ch 2.

Step 3.

Make **1 puff stitch** into the magic ring.

To make the puff stitch:

- Insert your hook into the ring
- Yarn over and pull up a loop
- Repeat that until you have pulled up loops **6 times**
- Then close the puff stitch

Step 4.

Ch 2.

Step 5.

Make another **puff stitch** into the magic ring.

Step 6.

Keep repeating this around the ring:

- **1 puff stitch**
- **ch 2**

Continue until you have:

- **10 puff stitches total**
- with **2 chains between each puff stitch**

Step 7.

After your 10th puff stitch, **ch 2**.

Step 8.

Join with a **sl st** to the **top of the first puff stitch**.

That completes the center round.

Part 2: Finish the Green Center**Step 9.**

Ch 1 and cut the yarn.

Step 10.

Use a yarn needle or your hook to hide the yarn tail through the back as neatly as you can.

Step 11.

Pull the magic ring tail tight to fully close the center.

Step 12.

Tie securely and hide that tail too.

Now the center of your sunflower is done.

Part 3: Make the Petals

Join your **yellow yarn** into **any chain-2 space** from the green center round.

Petal Repeat

Each petal is made in **one chain space**.

Step 1.

Join yellow yarn in a chain space.

Step 2.

Ch 3.

Step 3.

In the **same space**, make **1 puff stitch**.

Again, pull up loops **6 times** to form the puff.

Step 4.

Ch 3.

Step 5.

Make a **sl st** into the **top of the puff stitch**.

Step 6.

Ch 3.

Step 7.

Make a **sl st back into the same chain space** where you made the puff stitch.

That gives you one petal shape.

Step 8.

Move to the **next chain-2 space** with a **sl st**.

Step 9.

Repeat the same petal steps in every chain space around.

You will make **1 petal in each chain space**.

Since the center has **10 puff stitches** and **10 chain spaces**, you will end with:

- **10 petals total**

Part 4: Finish the Flower

Step 1.

After making the last petal, join with a **sl st** in the first joining point.

Step 2.

Ch 1.

Step 3.

Cut the yarn, leaving a **long tail** so you can attach the keychain clip.

Step 4.

Weave in or secure the tail as needed.

Part 5: Attach the Keychain Clip

Use the long tail or simply open the clip and attach it through the **top of any petal** you like.

Choose the side that looks best to you.

Your sunflower keychain is now complete.

Finished Project

You'll have a small crochet sunflower that works beautifully as:

- a keychain
 - a bag charm
 - a handmade gift
 - a cute quick crochet project for beginners
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Quick Pattern Summary

Center

- Magic Ring
- Puff,ch2Puff, ch 2Puff,ch2 around
- Total: **10 puff stitches**
- Join to first puff
- Fasten off green

Petals

In each chain space:

- ch 3
- puff stitch
- ch 3
- sl st in top of puff
- ch 3
- sl st in same space
- sl st to next chain space

Repeat around.

Total: **10 petals**

Beginner Tips

- If your puff stitches feel too tight, pull your loops a little higher before closing them.
- If the center curls a bit, gently flatten it with your fingers after tightening the magic ring.

- If your petals look uneven at first, don't worry. Once all petals are finished, the flower usually looks much more balanced.
 - Make sure you always work the yellow petals into the **chain spaces**, not into the puff stitches themselves.
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Suggested Abbreviations Section

- **MR** = Magic Ring
- **ch** = chain
- **sl st** = slip stitch
- **puff st** = puff stitch
