

Easy Crochet Tulip Keychain

Beginner-friendly • Quick gift project

Materials

- 5-ply medium weight yarn (50% cotton / 50% acrylic)
 - 2.20 mm crochet hook
 - Fiberfill stuffing
 - Tapestry needle
 - Keychain clip
 - Scissors
-

Abbreviations (US Terminology)

- MR – Magic Ring (Magic Circle)
- ch – chain
- sc – single crochet
- hdc – half double crochet
- dc – double crochet
- sl st – slip stitch
- inc – increase (2 sc in same stitch)
- st(s) – stitch(es)

Note:

Ch 1 at the beginning of rounds does NOT count as a stitch.

TULIP (Make 2)

Round 1

MR, ch 1

6 sc into the ring

Pull ring tight

Sl st to first sc to close

(6 sc)

Round 2

Ch 1

Inc in each stitch around (2 sc in every st)

Sl st to first sc
(12 sc)

Round 3

Ch 1
(1 sc, inc) repeat around
Sl st to first sc
(18 sc)

Round 4

Ch 1
(2 sc, inc) repeat around
Sl st to first sc
(24 sc)

Rounds 5–16

(12 straight rounds total after Round 4)

Ch 1
Sc in each stitch around
Sl st to first sc at end of each round
(24 sc each round)

After completing Round 16:

Ch 1
Cut yarn
Leave a long tail for sewing

Make a second tulip piece (same stitch counts, optional different color).

 LEAF (Green)

Foundation

Ch 16

Work into 2nd chain from hook:

1 sc
1 hdc
3 dc
1 hdc
1 sc
1 sl st

Continue working along the remaining chains using:

sc, hdc, 3 dc, hdc, sc

Repeat until you reach the last chain.

Turning Point

In the last chain:

Work 3 sc total

(This creates the rounded tip.)

Opposite Side

Working along the other side of the foundation chain:

hdc

3 dc

hdc

sc

Continue repeating the same stitch sequence down the side.

At the final turning chain:

Work 2 sc

Sl st into the bottom stitch

Sl st again to secure

Cut yarn.

Finishing the Leaf

Make an invisible join at the first stitch.

Weave tail through back loops only for a clean finish.

Leaf complete.

ATTACHING THE KEYCHAIN CLIP

1. Attach yarn to the keychain clip.
2. Ch 19 (or desired length — do not chain too tight).
3. Sc into the clip chain to secure.
4. Ch 20 more.
5. Cut yarn.

Thread chain through the center of the leaf.

Pass both ends through the center opening.

Tie a secure inside knot.

Tighten so knot sits neatly inside.

Repeat for second tulip.

FINAL ASSEMBLY

1. Stuff both tulip pieces with fiberfill.
2. Fold each piece in half.
3. Sew two opposite top points together to create tulip shape.
4. Hide yarn tails inside.

Repeat for second tulip.

Optional

Gently steam the leaf to shape.
(Use light steam only.)

Finished!

You now have a cute crochet tulip keychain —
a quick and beginner-friendly handmade gift.
